

Six Cy-Fair ISD Soccer Teams advance to second round

The Jersey Village High girls soccer team won its first playoff game in seven years because they were quick offensively and strong defensively against host Aldine High, the Class 5A-District 18 Champion, on Tuesday night at Aldine ISD's Thorne Stadium.

"It's pretty big," Lady Falcons first-year coach Christie Mestayer said. "Our district really prepared us."

Sophomore forward Megan Mugavero scored two first half goals – both on breakaways – to lead Jersey Village to a 5-0 victory over Aldine.

"Megan played well and read the ball well," Mestayer said. "She just wore out their defense."

Juniors Kadie Walaszczyk and Brittany Robinett and freshman Ashley Foster each scored a goal for the Lady Falcons, who will face Katy Cinco Ranch in the second round.

It was a good day for Cy-Fair ISD girls soccer teams, who went 4-0 in the opening round of the playoffs after going 0-4 in 2010; they outscored their District 18 counterparts, 20-1.

D-17 co-champion Cy Creek kicked off the doubleheader at Thorne with an 8-0 victory over Aldine MacArthur.

The Lady Cougars scored three goals in the first nine minutes. Junior Stephania Vazquez scored two goals with senior Aubrie O'Connor, juniors Christen May Amanda Frederick, Kara Simmang and Katie Johnson and sophomore Abby Buck each scoring a goal.

Cy Creek will face Memorial in the second round.

"We passed really well," Cy Creek coach Kathy Fling said. "Every practice, we worked on passing quicker and getting quicker touches on the ball."

Vazquez made a shot from about 18 feet away from the game.

"It was fabulous," Fling said. "It was a great shot."

The junior forward returned to the Lady Cougars' lineup last week after dealing with shin splints earlier this season.

"We were looking forward to playoffs," Vazquez said. "We had tough district competition. Our hard work paid off."

D-17 co-champion Cy-Fair defeated Alief Taylor, 5-1, at the Berry Center, and will face Katy Taylor in the second round.

Cy Ranch won its inaugural postseason game by blanking host Alief Elsik, and will meet Katy Seven Lakes in the next round.

On the boys side, Cy-Fair edged Aldine Nimitz, 2-1, and will play Katy Seven Lakes in the second round, while Cy Falls defeated Alief Elsik (they'll play Strake Jesuit next). Alief Hastings spoiled visiting Cy Lakes' first-ever playoff game with a 5-2 victory over the Spartans, and Aldine MacArthur defeated Langham Creek, 3-0.
